# Reading Town Meeting December 7, 1998 Dividence / Barrows Schools

### Financial Implications

- \$15.5 Million project over bonding period will cost the Town of Reading \$10.3 Million after SBAB reimbursement!!
- Over the next 5 years, bonding adds between \$450,000 and \$770,000 per year just for BANS before SBAB reimbursement... must come out of annual operating budgets
- Annual budgets will increase for enrollment increases district wide...bonding costs are added burdens

Revenue from Landfill will help...but there is no guarantee...there is no signed deal!!

- Questions for Finance Cmte.. Mr. Kiegley
  - Have they put a 5 / 10 year revenue and expense plan together as part of their reviews??
  - What does this level of debt do to our bond ratings for borrowing ??
  - What are the added annual costs for
    - Increased Enrollment ??
    - Increased Infrastructure ??
    - Did they calculate cost of Neighborhood Improvements in their projects ?? How Much ??

#### **Enrollment**

- Using SBC data and assuming 23 students per class,
  - Kindergarten requires 7-8 classrooms thru 2007
  - Gr. 1-5 requires 77-87 over same period
  - Existing space is 87 (81+6 portables)
- Centralized Kindergarten would allow all Grade 1-5 students to fit within existing 4 schools

- 1998 enrollment K-5 was <u>19 LESS</u> than 1997, of which majority of change was in Gr. K
- Regardless of <u>HOW</u> we vote tonight, the schools must deal with projected increases for next 3 years before new schools are on line

40% of the increased projected enrollment will already be in school before new bldgs. !!

#### <u>Space</u>

- Proposal is for a net of 21 new classrooms ...6 at Barrows and 15 @ Dividence
- Allocation of new 21 rooms is as follows:
  - 6 to eliminate existing portables
  - 8 for dedicated Art / Music space
  - 7 for reduced class size and enrollment increases...only 1/3rd of total new rooms!!!

#### High School

- Where is the "overdue" Architect report ???
  Letter to Supt. of Schools 8/25/98 said draft ready end of October ....why delayed ??
  Would it adversely impact this vote tonight??...one option cited was possible partial demolition to create more manageable space.
- Town continues to rent space to outside groups..eg: REAP...when considering building new space...*makes no sense* !!!

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- What about the High School renovation?? It is a major financial project...forecast at \$30 ++ Million....seems to make sense to me that we divert this money to help fund the High School and pull it in earlier in the plan...to do both is a road to OVERRIDES! These current elementary students will be the High School population soon and we must get at that project sooner. Approve this now and it will be LATER!!
- And then there is Killam??? When ?? How can we afford all this ????

#### "THE PLAN"

- · Rushed at best to Town Meeting
- · No allowance for neighborhood concerns
- Still have <u>no idea how to get access</u>...Fox Run / Sunset Rock / Roma ...lots of Private Ways
- Plans not definitized..compare to other School Projects..this is in the "have faith" category.
- *No traffic plans* or studies...major adverse impact to neighborhood!!!

- Sunset Rock developer already claiming adverse impact on his project... is a Civil Suit far behind??
- What about <u>extra costs to Town</u> for <u>sidewalks</u> and <u>traffic lights</u> on Franklin, plus School Zone restrictions, lights, etc.?? Where is this cost going to be covered??
- What about money for Eminent Domain land takings for sidewalks, etc. <u>WILL NOT BE</u>

  <u>FRIENDLY Takings!!!</u>

- Site is <u>longest Fire / Ambulance run</u> in Town...safety risk for students
- Site is remote and isolated...will have <u>major</u> <u>security issues</u> for students and local residents.
- Private Ways may block access without further action by Town Meeting... Eminent Domain and what will this cost to acquire land and upgrade to town standards for roads, etc. ???

- Eliminates significant open space acreage from passive recreation
- What about added costs for fields maintenance ???
- What about conservation issues...vernal pools ?? wetlands ?? protect flower species ??
- Rush to meet an accelerated SBAB date of March 1st is a roadmap for incomplete process by School Committee

- If School Committee misses this cycle, what is the big deal ??? by their own numbers, the one year increase in overall K-5 would equate to only 30 students....surely not a disaster!!
- Does the School Committee have a way to fund all the extra's...how much in added annual operating expenses?? Numbers bouncing!!

#### **Summary**

- Central Kindergarten <u>major option that must</u> <u>be considered</u> as an alternative to Town Mtg.
- High School has space available
- Cost to town is \$10.3 Million after SBAB
- Dividence Road plan only *roughly developed*
- Significant financial evaluation lacking
- 40% of students will already be in K-5 before new schools are on line
- No data until last minute for our review

- Finance Committee met for no more than 2 hours on this entire subject....with no advance study material...they got a last minute data dump like us !! NO WAY they can do their job adequately as ADVISORY to Town

  Meeting....I ask the Chairman to specifically identify the extent / content of their 2 hour review. What analysis was done??
- Who paid for all the Blue and yellow cards and postage?? .. I heard the PTO's...money given for children's benefit used for politicizing this process??? *Have some gone too far*??
